Robert Taylor Homes with greenspace

People in buildings with trees socialized more with neighbors, had a stronger sense of community, and felt safer.





When the research team made 100 observations of outdoor common spaces, they found adults and children gathered more often in spaces with trees, compared to spaces with no trees


Of 150 residents interviewed, 14% of residents living in barren conditions have threatened to use a knife or gun against their children versus 3% for the residents living in green conditions.

One surprising finding from the photo simulation study was that residents identified settings with trees as places where they would feel safe.

Defensible space theory: the physical layout of buildings influences informal contact & informal surveillance, which are linked to community strength and crime levels


