8. TEACHING**(a) *Areas of special interest and accomplishments***

During the last 18 years I have taught a variety of undergraduate courses from first to fourth years, related to Economic Geography, and the Geography of Japan and the Pacific Rim (these are numbered as -

Geog 120, 210, 281, 380, 461, 468 and 481). At the graduate level I have taught seminars on Asian Urban Development, and the Changing Geography of Asia (Geog 532, Geog 539). I have also led a major field trip course to Western Japan, in May 2003 (Geog 379).

From its inception in 1990 I have been closely involved in the UBC-Ritsumeikan Academic Exchange Programme. This involves 100 students from Ritsumeikan University, Kyoto, Japan, spending a year-long academic program here at UBC. I helped to develop the course known as Geography 281 (cross-listed as a Faculty of Arts course ASTU 202). This focuses on the history, geography, political, social and economic trends in Canada, Japan and the Pacific Rim. It is taught in an innovative environment that has Japanese students and regular UBC students together in classes and tutorials. The course is co-taught with a visiting Japanese professor every year.

Preface: Research Contributions

Over the past twenty five years my research interests have focused on three major areas dealing with various aspects of Japan and the Pacific Rim. Of primary importance have been a number of studies designed to examine the globalization of the Japanese economy and the operations of Japanese companies in Pacific Rim countries (e.g. Canada, Australia, China and Southeast Asia). This has involved identifying characteristics which set Japanese firms apart from other multinational corporations (MNCs), as well as understanding their spatial patterns around the Pacific Rim and within individual countries, and the implications of their investment, production and trading outcomes. Output from these studies have appeared in journals such as 'Environment and Planning A', 'Urban Geography', 'Economic Geography', 'Regional Studies', 'Geoforum', 'The Canadian Geographer', 'Growth and Change', 'Journal of Property Research', 'Tijdschrift voor economische en sociale geografie' and in other articles and book chapters included in the publications list below.

A second major research theme has been the impact of globalization on Japanese cities and regions and government plans for restructuring local economies. This has led to papers on Yokohama, Osaka and Nagoya published in 'Regional Studies', 'Urban Studies', 'Cities', and 'The Asian Geographer' as well as a number of book chapters listed below. A book-length monograph on the rebuilding of Kobe after the 1995 Hanshin earthquake is being prepared.

A third theme has explored the various Pacific Rim linkages to British Columbia (BC) and Vancouver. A number of studies concerning BC's trade and tourism links across the Pacific, immigration and multiculturalism in Vancouver have been published in 'The Canadian Geographer', 'The Canadian Journal of Regional Studies', 'Progress in Planning', 'Regional Studies', 'Environment and Planning C', 'Economic Geography', 'Western Geography', and 'BC Geographical Series', also in book chapters listed below.

Because of the practical and policy emphasis of much of the above work I have published working papers and articles in various newsletters hoping to reach a wider audience than usually expected with articles in the major geographical and other social science journals. These working papers or essays are not listed in this publications record, but comprise over 30 working papers including those of the RIIM-Metropolis Centre, UBC Centre for Human Settlements, and the Canadian Real Estate Research Bureau; together with pieces written in 'The Japan Foundation Newsletter', 'Global Research Institute, Korea University', 'The UBC Institute of Asian Research Newsletter', 'Conference Proceedings of the Canada-Japan Trade Council' and 'Conference Proceedings of the Japan Studies Association of Canada'.
