



## How to add MFRE in your LinkedIn profile's Education section.

**Note:** You don't necessarily need to delete your previous UBC entry. You can have both, UBC and MFRE as your schools in your Education section. Adding the MFRE entry will allow specific alumni stats and will make you part of our new MFRE network. Your profile will look as the image below.




Follow these steps:

1. Log in into your LinkedIn account.
2. Go to your profile page by clicking on your name or picture



3. Once you are on your profile, scroll down to the Education section and click on the '+' or 'add' button on the top right corner.



#### 4. Fill in the fields as follows:

- School: Type “MFRE” under School and select UBC Master of Food and Resource Economics.
- Degree: Type and select “Master’s degree” under Degree.
- Field of Study: Type “Food and Resource Economics”.
- Date: Enter the year you started the program and the year you graduated from.
- Description: Add the following  
*“The MFRE is a unique one-year professional master’s program combining economics, policy and business as seen from an agriculture, food, natural resources and environmental perspective.”*
- Save it.
