

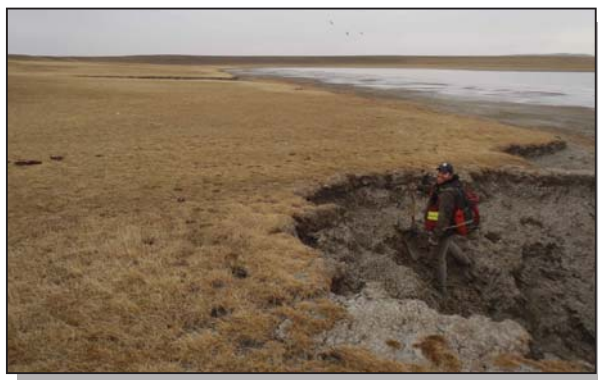
# 2014 Pacific Student Quaternary Meeting
