A Proclamation

ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom, Canada and Her other Realms and Territories, Queen, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith

To all to whom these presents shall come – Greeting

WHEREAS Education Week highlights British Columbia's commitment to being the best educated, most literate jurisdiction on the continent, and

WHEREAS Education Week is an opportunity to feature an education system designed to transform the lives of students by harnessing individual knowledge and potential, and

WHEREAS Education Week emphasizes our need to find innovative new ways to connect people with the knowledge and skills they need to contribute to British Columbia's future, and

WHEREAS Education Week is a celebration of the contributions British Columbia's dedicated parents, educators, administrators, trustees and support staff make in the lives of students, our education system and our communities, and

WHEREAS Education Week underscores the importance of education as a key driver in British Columbia's creative economy and its future potential, and

WHEREAS Our Lieutenant Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, has been pleased to enact Order in Council 903 on October 11, 2002;

NOW KNOW YE THAT We do by these presents proclaim and declare that the week of March 27 to 31, 2006, inclusive, shall be known as

"Education Week"

in the Province of British Columbia.
