PHIL 102 Hendricks Spring 2017 "In the context of internalized colonialism, the material conditions of poverty and violence that condition the colonial situation appear muted to the colonized because they are understood to be the product of one's own cultural deficiencies" (Coulthard 114).

In <u>conditions</u> of *internalized colonialism*, *poverty and violence* <u>seem lessened</u> because <u>the colonized think</u> they are the *product of their own cultural* <u>problems</u>. "First Nations communities can now lease designated reserve lands if a majority attending a meeting called for that purpose vote to do so, regardless of how many people show up. Previously, approval required the support of a majority of eligible voters."

(CBC article on Idle No More)

Indigenous groups **can lease** their **reserve lands** if a <u>majority of people at a meeting</u> **vote to do so** <u>no matter how many people are at the meeting</u>. <u>Before this</u>, **a majority of eligible voters** was <u>needed</u>. With respect to those approaches deemed 'legitimate' in defending our rights, emphasis is usually placed on formal 'negotiations' ... And if need be coupled with largely symbolic cts of peaceful, nondisruptive protest that abide by Canada's 'rule of law'" (Coulthard 166)
