How do we evaluate resources for selection and curation? We want to save time (and money). Having a five finger rule (mnemonic device) can aid in this.

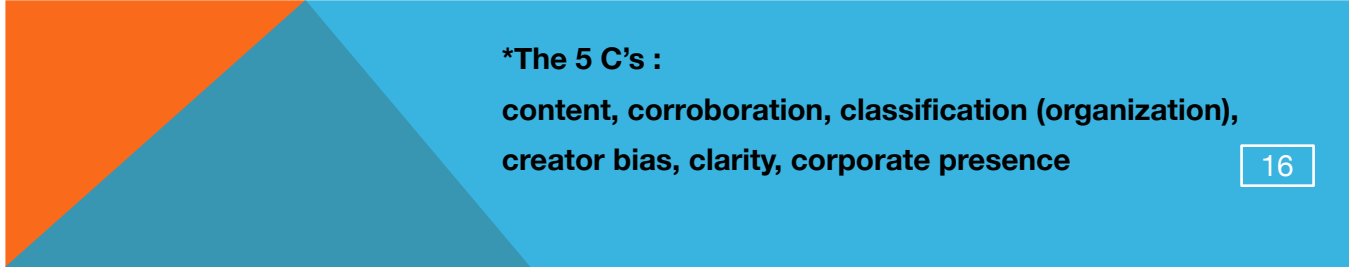

Have a look at these sites and attempt to develop a 5 finger rules for evaluation.

- **Reliability**
 - Corroborated Source? Double checked...;
checking domain (easywhois.com)
 - Bias/objectivity
 - Accuracy
- **Accessibility**
 - Appropriate reading level, graphics
- **Relevance - content**
- **Organization of content - FAQ; design; user friendly**
- **Advertising (chrome plug in to block - adblocker extension; disconnect.me extension - eliminates tracking cookies etc)**



***The 5 C's :**
content, corroboration, classification (organization),
creator bias, clarity, corporate presence

Five W's of Web Site Evaluation
Who, What, When, Where, Why

THE FIVE W'S OF WEB SITE EVALUATION

WHO
Who wrote the pages and are they an expert?
Is a biography of the author included?
How can I find out more about the author?

WHAT
What does the author say is the purpose of the site?
What else might the author have in mind for the site?
What makes the site easy to use?
What information is included and does this information differ from other sites?

WHEN
When was the site created?
When was the site last updated?

WHERE
Where does the information come from?
Where can I look to find out more about the sponsor of the site?

WHY
Why is this information useful for my purpose?
Why should I use this information?
Why is this page better than another?

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Cathy Shrock's criteria – just one way to assess. May be of more use to have your own set of criteria (as we've begun today). This may be of use to your students perhaps?
