Basic Medical Insurance

- BC Residents: MSP
- Covers: doctor visits, hospital visits, tests
 - Required





Extended Medical Insurance

- Often offered by student union or employer
 - Covers: some vision, dental, prescription, travel health
 - Required

Emergency Travel Insurance

- May be include in an extended insurance plan
 - Covers: medical evacuation, emergency surgeries
 - Recommended

Travel Coverage

You are covered for up to 120 days per trip and up to \$5,000,000 per incident for an unlimited number of trips taken during the time you're covered. Your coverage includes hospital, physician, and other services for emergency treatment of an injury or illness while traveling outside of the province in which you reside (including international travel). It covers reasonable and customary charges, which are in excess of the provincial health-care allowance. International students (including US students) who are not permanent Canadian residents may not use their travel health coverage when traveling to their country of origin.

Compared with other 120-day travel insurance plans, your Plan costs less and covers you more.

Note: You must have Canadian provincial health-care coverage or equivalent coverage to make travel claims.

The current policy year is from **Sept. 1, 2016 - Aug. 31, 2017.**

\$1,500 for trip cancellation

Medi-Assist

Worldwide Emergency Medical Assistance

Immediate, confidential help for any medical concern while travelling

Pacific Blue Cross (PBC), through Medi-Assist, provides assistance to members and their dependents who experience emergencies while travelling outside of their province of residence.

The Medi-Assist service does not pay your medical expenses, but it does provide the following:

- Notifies your insurer, Pacific Blue Cross, to facilitate claims payment
- Puts you in touch with qualified licensed physicians and medical services
- Connects you with qualified legal services
- Assists with lost baggage or stolen documents/money
- Arranges consular assistance and travel advice
- Assists with arrangement of repatriation of remains in the event of a death
- Helps to contact your family or business partners
- Assists with transfer of patient from one facility to another, or to return patient to province of residence

Payment of medical expenses may be delayed or refused if the member fails to contact Medi-Assist within 24 hours of the emergency.

When and how to contact Medi-Assist

Call Medi-Assist within 24 hours of an emergency. A customer service representative is accessible to you 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Assistance is provided in both French and English. Have your Medi-Assist card, a pen and paper ready.

Record these numbers on your Medi-Assist Card, so that you have them on hand when you call:

- Your Provincial health care number
- Your Pacific Blue Cross policy and ID numbers

Purpose of the community field experience (CFE)

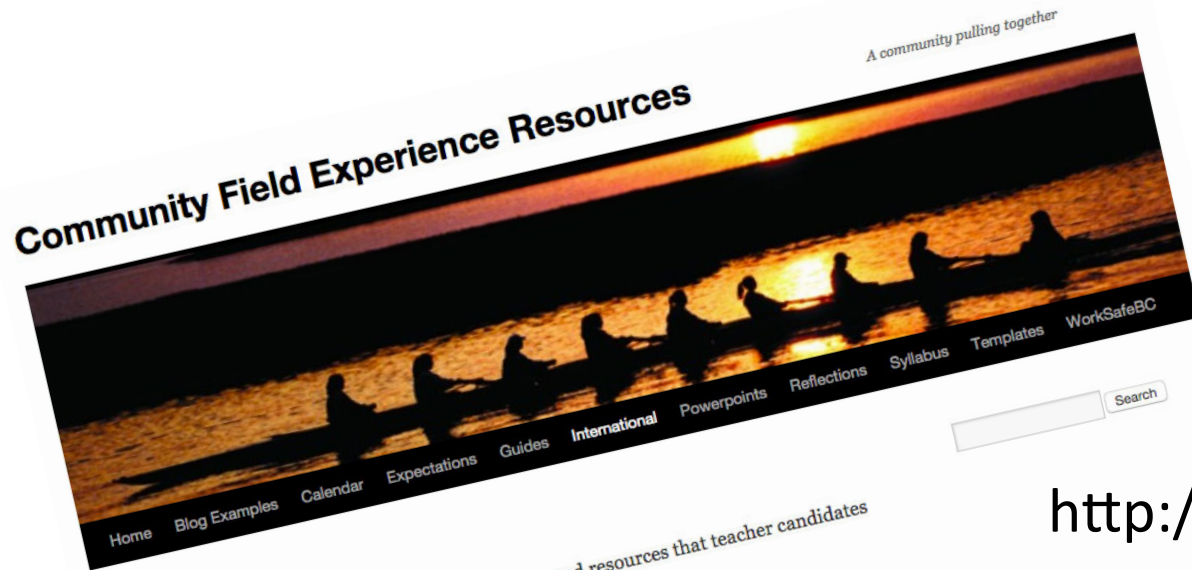
- Publishing companies (reviewers, sales reps)

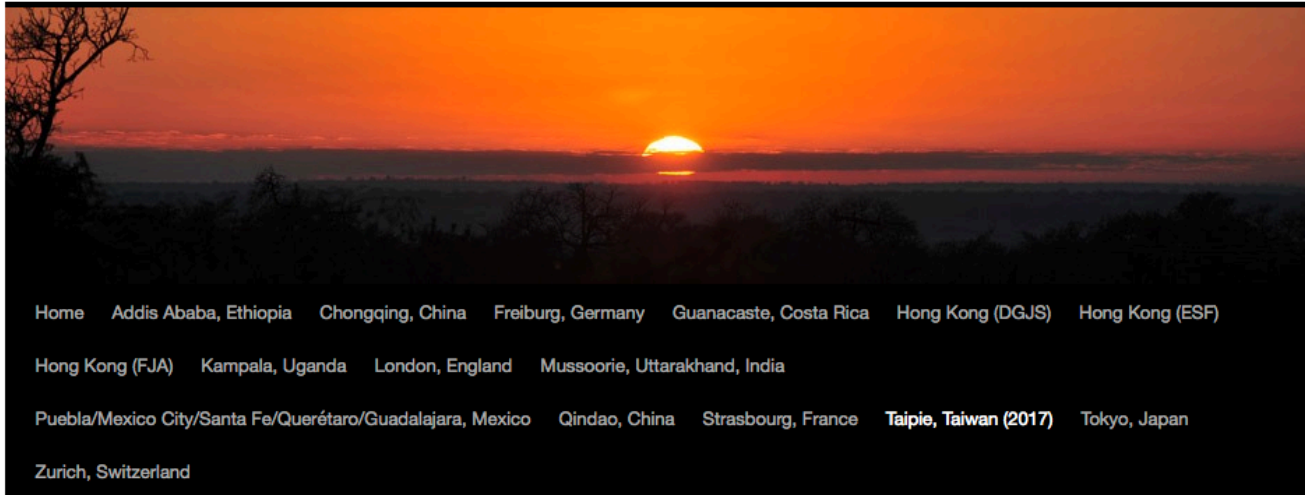

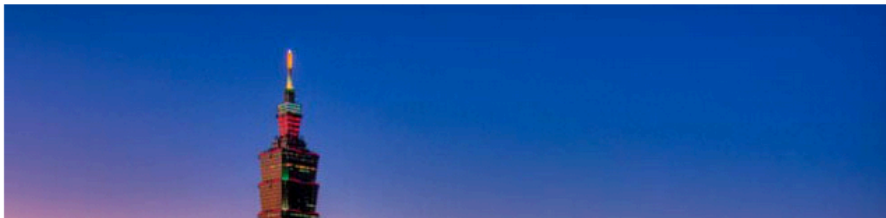
