- Most densely populated Canadian city




Vancouver-Host of 2010 Winter Olympics





2 steps:

- 1. Apply at the UBC Carding Office located WITHIN the UBC Bookstore- 6200 University Blvd
- 2. Activate into an iClass Card at HA 443. For your convenience, you can also email access@sauder.ubc.ca your name, student number, iClass number (first 5 or 5 digits after the * or 2- at the bottom backside of card), program of study and program end date.

Multipurpose iClass Card grants you access to UBC Library services, Food Services dining convenience & discounts, keyless entry to areas at the Sauder School of Business



Compass Card (U-Pass):

- Once you have your UBC student card, link your U-Pass with the Compass card online at <u>upassbc.translink.ca</u>
- Unlimited access to Translink Bus, SkyTrain, and SeaBus services (all zones)
- Cost: \$41/month = \$164/4-month term
- Passes valid from first to last day of month
- Starting on the 16th of each month, students can request their U-Pass BC benefit online to use transit for the next month

iMed—Health Insurance for International Students

Cost: \$252 (covers 4-month term):

August 30th, 2019 – January 2nd, 2020

With iMed card, you don't have to pay for your visit if you see a doctor at <u>Student</u> <u>Health Service at UBC</u> or the <u>University Village Medical & Dental Clinic</u> in the Village on campus (may be required to pay up front in another clinic or hospital in BC)
