What, where and when

The exam is closed book. No notes of any sort, no calculators and definitely no phones.

Bring things to write with and your ID. Everything else in your closed bag under your seat.

Where and when

Topics and difficulty

All topics covered in class may be on the exam.

Not all questions of equal difficulty.

We strongly recommend that you skim all questions before starting them - do easier problems first!

We strongly recommend that you skim all long answer questions before starting them - do easier problems first!

There will be a couple of more challenging questions - we recommend that you identify these and do them last.

Remember that you do not need to answer all questions to do well on the exam.

Pen vs Pencil

Since the exams will be scanned, we recommend that you use *dark* pencil.

In general we recommend using a dark pencil instead of pen.

If you do use pen - make sure you bring "white out tape" or some sort of correction fluid.

Please do not use a light grey pencil - it is very hard to read

If you do use pen then make sure it is blue or black

Extra paper

There should be plenty of room on the paper for your work

There will be 2 blank pages at the end of the paper if you need extra space

If you use these pages and want that work to be marked then you ***MUST*** indicate
----> at the original question that you used one of the pages at the end - for example write "Continued
on page 12"

----> on the blank page indicate the question number you are working on.
