
I will be defining the term *Blue Chip*.

Parenthetical Definition: The *blue chip* (nationally, well known) stock is up 2% today.

Sentence Definition: Blue chips is an active, nationally recognized common stock with a history of having strong investment qualities.

Expanded Definition: Blue chips is an active, nationally recognized common stock with a history of having strong investment qualities. The term blue chip is derived from poker. Poker chips come in three colors, white, red and blue, blue having the highest value ("Blue chip (stock market)", 2017). Blue chip stocks are usually components of prestigious indexes, like the Dow Jones Industrial Average, or the TSX-60. While they are appropriate to hold as the core of your portfolio, they should not make up its entirety (Staff, 2017). The following are examples of some of Canada's largest blue chips, Suncor Energy Inc, Telus Corporation, Fortis Inc Cineplex Inc and Sun Life Financials Inc ("Top 35 Canadian blue chip stocks", 2017).
