Course Description

This course provides an introduction to tort law: the law that recognises and responds to civil wrongdoing. In the Autumn term we address intentional and dignitary torts as well as the overarching theories and goals of tort law. In the Spring term we address the law of no-fault compensation schemes, negligence and strict liability.

Learning Objectives

- Identify and demonstrate fundamental techniques of Canadian common law analysis and reasoning.
- Situate torts within the broader legal system.
- Employ legal analysis techniques, such as issue-spotting, issue-sorting, and the IRAC structure.
- Understand and assess different theories, approaches, and goals of tort law.
