
## SITES OF SOME INTERESTING BRYOPHYTES OF STANLEY PARK



SITE	BRYOPHYTES OF INTEREST
Α	Atrichum is a common moss, but this is a good place to see it
В	Sphagnum – grows in numerous wet places in the park
С	Overturned tree – root is a great place to look at a number of different species
D	Fontinalis antipyretica – aquatic moss (nearby goblin moss on overturned tree)
E	Scapania undulata – aquatic liverwort
F	Old stump with nice Lepidozia reptans (green fuzz)
G	Hylocomium splendens – also nice place to see rhizoids/protonema of
	Rhizomnium glabrescens
Н	Riccardia on wood sculpture
I	Overturned log has lots of mosses including Tetraphis pellucida
J	Leucolepis acanthoneuron – common, but good place to see it
K	Ditch is a good place for Pellia neesiana and a number of haircap mosses
L	The best place in the park to see Schistostega pinnata (goblin gold)
M	Conocephalum salebrosum – in wet depression
N	Cephalozia bicuspidata – with sporophytes
0	Bazzania denudata and Scapania bolanderi
Р	Calypogeia azurea – blue liverwort
Q	Fissidens limbatus – pocket moss
