- From the early 1870's to -1996 thousand's of First Nations, Inuit and Metis children were forced to attend residential schools in an attempt to aggressively assimilate them into dominant culture.
- The Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada was established in 2008 to examine the legacy of these residential schools. It has conducted events in cities across Canada to collect survivor testimony and to educate the public. The commission expires in 2014.
