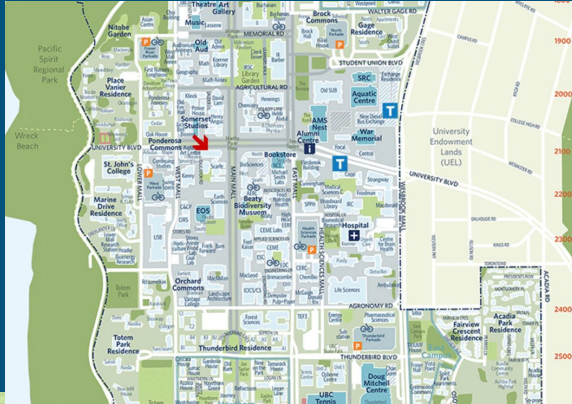

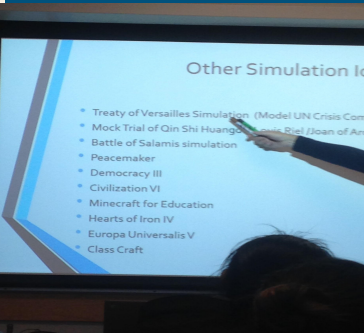

Human-Environment Interaction

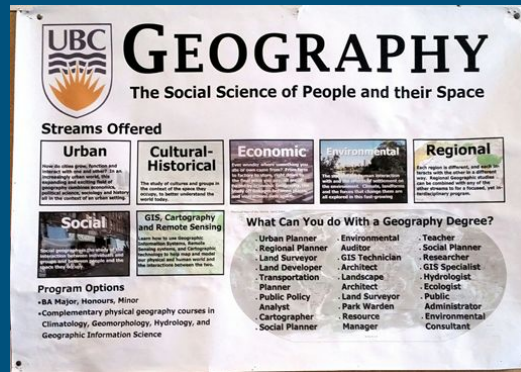
UBC focuses on waste reduction education by coordinating recycling, composting, e-waste and litter reduction.
