

# Self and Collective Care Series: An Intersectional Exploration of Interventions to Support Undergraduate Nursing Student Wellbeing

# Introduction to the Study

Dear Nursing Student,

According to our records, you are enrolled as a 3rd year undergraduate student in the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program. As a result, you are invited to participate in a research study that aims to explore students' experiences with the Self & Collective Care Series.

The goal of this study is to improve our understanding of the experiences of students with the Self & Collective Care Series. This understanding can help tell us about some of the possible strengths and challenges of the program. This knowledge will help to improve future delivery of the program to help to improve the experiences of prospective nursing students.

The **research questions** guiding this study include:

- Does the Self & Collective Care Series support students to develop reflexivity and skills related to the three domains of interest: (a) stress management/self and collective care; (b) mindful and reflective practice; and (c) social connection and belonging?
