Indigenous Women Leaders in the Provincial First Nations Court

The New Westminster First Nations Court was created in 2006 by Cree provincial court Judge Marion Buller. It is the oldest of the four First Nations courts in British Columbia. This lecture focuses on the four phases of the 3-year SSHRC Indigenous therapeutic jurisprudence project, the leadership of the Indigenous women within the courts, and the role of the international Indigenous community within the project.
