Be a teacher if asked. If someone asks you what you are doing, be a teacher and explain how this observation work you are doing is helping you learn to see PEOPLE and avoid seeing STEREOTYPES.
You can bring (a) peer(s) from class to do the activity with. If you meet with two or more others, each person must equally contribute to the activity.
