The Faculty of Education seeks an individual who can contribute to our programs with expertise in Educational Core Studies. The Faculty has a strong orientation towards social justice issues in education and is committed to enacting the themes, vision, values and mission of the University's Strategic Plan - mâmawohkamâtowin: Our Work, Our People, Our Communities. Consistent with this orientation, all undergraduate students in the Faculty of Education take common Core Studies courses intended to foster and support critical examinations of schooling practices, curriculum, and pedagogy. Priority areas for the Faculty include the integration of anti-oppressive pedagogy across programs and subject areas, through the delivery of the Core Studies classes.

Duties:

The individual will be responsible to teach undergraduate and graduate classes in Core Studies, supervise undergraduate students in field experiences, supervise graduate students, assume active involvement in Faculty endeavours and engage in individual and collaborative scholarly research.

Qualifications:

The successful individual should possess a Ph.D. degree with an academic focus on anti-oppressive education and a research and scholarship focus in this area. The individual should demonstrate successful teaching experience in K – 12 schools and university environments.
