

# Employment Opportunity: **Department Head/Professor**

Department of Leadership and Foundations

### **Position Function**

The Department Head provides academic and administrative leadership for a department of 17 faculty and staff and more than 350 students. In addition to providing quality service to the clientele of the department, the Department Head is responsible for budgetary actions, program development, and personnel management and evaluation. The Department Head will promote a positive environment which stimulates teaching, research, and service. The primary goals of the Department Head are to provide leadership for departmental programs and to assist faculty in meeting goals associated with instruction, scholarly activities, and service.

**Faculty support:** Recruit and retain a diverse faculty from peer institutions across the country; coordinate and evaluate faculty workload; mentor faculty through the promotion and tenure process; evaluate faculty performance for promotion, tenure, salary increases, and dismissals; support continuing professional development of faculty.

Departmental operation: Collaborate with faculty in developing long-range plans and goals; monitor academic program offerings; ensure that university policies and procedures are implemented as they relate to the department and to the clientele it serves; collaborate with faculty in determining departmental strengths, weaknesses, and changes that are needed; manage the department budget and develop a revenue-generating plan; maintain facilities and equipment to support faculty and departmental goals; determine office and space allocations.

## **Duties and Responsibilities**

**Communication:** Conduct monthly departmental meetings; meet with the Dean to represent the interests of the department; assist with data collections for departmental reports, self-studies, etc.

Other: Coordinate advising of students; oversee graduate programs; advise students with curriculum problems; teach according to College of Education policy; participate in professional development activities; participate in professional organizations; perform other duties as assigned.

### Minimum Qualifications

An earned doctorate with appropriate experience in one of the department's areas of specialization (Educational Leadership, Community College Leadership, and Foundations) from an accredited university or college; a record of excellence in teaching, scholarly achievement in research, and recognized professional service at the national level; the ability to communicate and work effectively with others; a commitment to working with a diverse population of students and faculty; and familiarity with accreditation standards and processes. The selected candidate must also have an understanding of all disciplines and methods of inquiry represented in the department and must qualify for tenure and the rank of professor of Leadership and Foundations.

## **Preferred Qualifications**

A demonstrated record of administrative experience at the program director level or above; success in securing and administering external funding; experience in online program delivery; membership and leadership in applicable professional societies.
