Assistant Professor in Educational Administration

The Department of Educational Studies at The Ohio State University invites applications for a tenure-track position in its distinguished and nationally recognized Educational Administration program at the rank of Assistant Professor, to begin in autumn semester 2014. The Educational Administration Program is consistently ranked among the top ten programs in the country. The program prepares scholars for leadership roles in school administration and educational policy organizations as well as faculty positions in academe. The Educational Administration curriculum includes a PhD program, which prepares students for roles in academe as researchers and policy makers, an innovative EdD, and an MA in school administration that collaborates with educational agencies to advance leadership preparation including superintendent, principal, and teacher leader licensure programs.

Responsibilities: We seek a faculty member who has a deep knowledge of P-12 administrative school leadership practice and action research in educational settings. We address the societal call to create a new generation of highly prepared, highly qualified school administrators. We welcome applicants with expertise in urban education. The candidate is expected primarily to teach graduate courses in our licensure, masters, and doctoral programs; advise students; conduct an active program of scholarship leading to refereed publications; potentially acquire external funding to support research; and participate in campus and professional service activities. Experience in the use of technology and delivering on-line courses is expected.

Qualifications: The candidate must hold an earned doctorate in Educational Administration or a related field from an accredited institution at time of selection. P-12 administrative experience is preferred. Building level experience and/or a demonstrated research focus on educational leadership/administration in P-12 settings also are desirable. Additionally, university teaching will be viewed positively. The applicant should have an understanding and knowledge of multicultural and diversity issues, and potential applications to pedagogy, programming, and service activity. The successful applicant should have a record of scholarship commensurate with appointment to assistant professor rank, a commitment to and readiness for high quality teaching, advising, and mentoring, potential for external funding, and demonstrated active involvement in professional associations.

Review of applications will begin approximately January 8, 2014 and will continue until the position is filled. To be most competitive, candidates are strongly encouraged to complete applications by January 7, 2014. Please submit a letter of application, curriculum vitae, three letters of recommendation, a statement pertaining to future research plans, a one-page statement identifying the critical issues facing school leaders, and one example of scholarly writing to:
