Consider submitting your piece within one of the following submission categories below. While you are not required to choose a submission category, it may act as a helpful frame for the form and style of your piece.

#### Ideas in Scholarship

This submission category offers a space for contributors to share their written work that focuses on ideas within any disciplinary tradition of scholarship and academia. For example, contributors may submit writings that contend with areas of research, methodology, reviews of literature, and discussions in theory and philosophy. Both "ideas" and "scholarship" are broadly conceived, and as such we welcome submissions that reflect the diversity of ways in which we understand ideas, scholarship, and education.

### People and Happenings

This submission category offers a space for contributors to share work on the people and the happenings within education. For example, contributors to this category may submit dialogues, narratives, interviews, essays, and journalistic submissions in which the central focus is on people and/or interesting events happening within realms of education.

#### The Arts and Education

This submission category offers a space for contributors to share their creative pieces on education that are from any arts-based tradition. For example, contributors may submit poetry, fiction, film, sound art, music, and visual art that contends with educational ideas and/or questions.
