Folding Voice: Posthumanist Methodologies, and Environmental Education and Activism Research

This presentation focuses on the implications of posthumanist approaches to 'interview data' in a field such as environmental activism/

justice education, in which 'giving voice' and recognition are considered important. Marcelina will discuss how Deleuze's concept of the fold informed methodological choices regarding data generation in her dissertation research on education in environmental movements. The talk provokes non-representational approaches to research, showing how a flat, relational ontology treats voice as provocation, event, and fold.
