III. VOCABULAIRE & GRAMMAIRE

There will be exercises on the following, not necessarily in the following order. You should always answer in French unless the exercise indicates otherwise.

A. Les verbes au présent, au futur immédiat, et à l'impératif.

Conjugate the verbs in parentheses with the right form of the present tense, the immediate future, or the imperative.

B. Les articles

Definite articles (le, la, les) – indefinite articles (un, une, des) – partitive article (de) – use with il v a.

C. Les prépositions

The prepositions à and de - their use in combination with articles (au, à la, aux – du, de la, de l', des) - their use with il y a – other prepositions of place (sur, sous, dans, à gauche de, etc.)

D. Les adjectifs et les possessifs.

Choosing the right one to make sense (= vocabulary), making the necessary agreements, and i nserting it in the right place to complete the sentences given.

E. Les nombres.

You will be asked to write out some numbers in full. Ex. 100 = cent

F. Les questions.

Questions using "est-ce que..." - questions using inversion ("subject verb" --> "verb-subject?") question-words (comment, pourquoi, etc.). *Exercise structure: Ask the question that would elicit each underlined expression above the answer* provided. Use the "est-ce que" structure or inversion; you should use inversion at least once. Example : _ $(\rightarrow$ Solution: Comment vous appelez-vous?) Réponse : Je m'appelle <u>Alain</u>.

IV. PARTIE AUDITIVE

(15 points: dictée = 10, compréhension = 5) Write out the dictation that you hear read, in French.

V. COMPOSITION

(20 points)

Minimum length: 120 words

You will have a choice of topics: please write about ONE of them. Avoid subjects that would require specialized French vocabulary that you would not know at this point. Required minimum length: **120 words**. It is to your advantage to mark the 120th word clearly. (We count mistakes in French only up to that point.) Criteria for grading: in marking, your instructor will take into account:
