How can I find more information for each School?

Each listing on the [Outbound MBA Exchange Program](#) page has a link to the School's main website, Factsheet and Brochure. Typically, the Factsheet contains the most relevant information for exchange. Most Factsheets have been updated for 2023. If your school choice has an old Factsheet, you can use it for now, until we receive the new one and update it.

May I apply to more than one Exchange School?

You are encouraged to apply for three different exchange schools. You will list your choices in order of preference. If your first choice is oversubscribed, we will consider your placement in your second or 3rd choice. You will only be selected for one school, so your order of preference is important. The RHL puts our best effort into placing students into their first choice, however, given the competitive nature of our partner schools, we can't guarantee placement.

What is I am only interested in one school?

You can apply for one school only. In this case, if for any reason your top choice is not available, you will not be placed on exchange. You will need to enter the same school 3 times on the application form if the form requires a response for each entry.

Do I need to write a separate essay for each school?

Yes, you will need to make an essay entry for each school. However, you may have common paragraph for general reasons for participating in exchange, and then also separate paragraph/s with reasoning for each of the schools you're applying for.

What is a Proposed Study Plan?

A Proposed Study Plan is a list of courses that you might be able to take at the exchange partner university. You need to find an exchange partner that offers sufficient courses to fulfill your degree and track

requirements. Proposed Study Plan is tentative, and will not be necessarily the same as your Final Study Plan, once you are accepted into the exchange program.

How do I develop a Proposed Study Plan?

- 1) Use the calendar (course catalogue) of the exchange program university or universities in which you are interested. Resource materials and course calendars are located on the host School's website.
- 2) You should list more courses than you are required to take, in order to ensure that there are sufficient courses at the partner university that are suitable for your track.
- 3) Course selection will not be precise at this point. Do your best to research what courses the school offers during the Fall term so you have a good understanding of what could be available for you.

How many courses will I need to take?

Courses at other universities will not normally be worth the same number of credits as the UBC MBA courses. A 1.5 credit UBC MBA course is equivalent to 20 contact hours.

Generally, **you are expected to complete the equivalent of 160 contact hours** which equals to 12 UBC credits while on exchange for the full term (80 hours if you participate in P6 only and are returning to UBC MBA for P7). Some exchange courses may cover the length equivalent to two UBC MBA courses. If you are not returning in December to take the Capstone with your Cohort, then you will need an equivalent of 170 contact hours.

Students are required to take a full-time course load at the exchange university. At this stage, just do your best to estimate what a full course-load at your host school will be for the term/half-term.

Do I need to get my Proposed Study Plan approved?

Formal approval of this **Proposed** Study Plan is **NOT** required. This is a preliminary list in support of the academic rationale of your application. You must choose an exchange program that offers significant course work relevant to your area of academic interest because not all courses listed will be offered each year or in the fall term.

What if my course selection changes?

We understand that not all courses are available every year, that you may not be eligible to take some courses, and that timetable conflicts may prevent you from taking all of your selected courses. At the application stage, we expect you to do some basic research on which courses might be available for you to take at your host school.

Will we be able to travel on my exchange in the Fall of 2023?

At this time, we have reasonable hope that in-person exchange will continue in the Fall 2023 term. Currently our partners are planning in-person delivery of their programs. Should there be any national, international, UBC or other official policies preventing in-person participation in exchange, they will supersede any exchange offers made. It is good practice to avoid booking non-refundable travel and to consider trip cancellation insurance.
