

Basic ID unique water plants with white flower and leaves floated above water

Leaf arrangement/Foliage:round with a deep slit at the base, 4 too 12 inches in diameter,

toothless, on long stems

Flower/cone/fruit description(s): Single flower 3 too 6 inches across floating on still and slow moving waters. They are fragrant, *close at night and open in the morning*. When water levels are low the leaves may rise above the water and become a bit wavy around the edges. Fruit are round and berry-like
