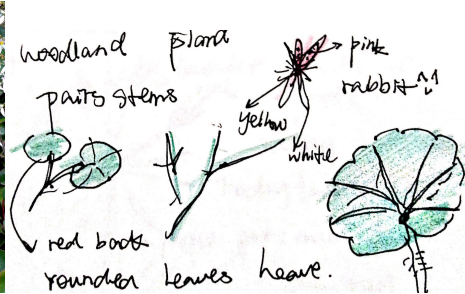
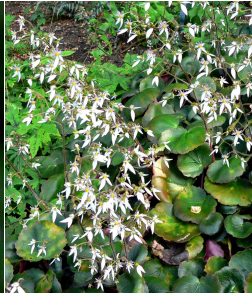


282. *Saxifraga stolonifera*

strawberry begonia

Saxifragaceae(L5)



**Basic ID** *rabbit ear like plants with typical round leaves in this family*

**Zone:** 6 to 9

**Type:** herbaceous perennial

**Height and spread:** 1.5 ft/2 ft

**Bloom time:** May to June

**Evergreen/deciduous:** Evergreen

**Flower & Fall color:** white

**Leaf arrangement/Foliage:** Leaf: Colorful, long-stalked leaves

**Flower/cone/fruit description(s):** Showy, 18" tall bearing loose, airy panicles of asymmetrical white flowers (1" wide), each flower having two large lower petals and 3-4 smaller upper petals.

**Other:** *Winter Interest*

**Common:** *elegant flowers*

**Tough:** tough

**Maintainence:** medium

**Light:** Part shade to full shade

**Water use:** Medium

**Soil requirement:** moist, organically rich, light, well-drained soils

**Maintenance advice:** 1. If grown outdoors as a ground cover, it should be sited in a protected location and mulched in winter.

**Disease:** Root rot may occur in poorly drained soils. Aphids, slugs and spider mites may appear.
