# **HIST 483 Asian Migrations to the Americas**

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Class Hours: Monday, Wednesday, Friday 9-10, Buchanan B213

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This course will explore the history of migration from Asia to, and throughout, Canada, the United States and South America from the late 19th to the early 21st century. We will be covering the Asian exclusion era, World War Two, and the post-Immigration and Nationality Act of 1965 period, touching upon topics such as Japanese-American/Canadian internment and South-East Asian refugees. We will examine the impact of migration from different parts of Asia on local, national and transnational communities. Emphasis will be on understanding how and why historical events are remembered and forgotten, and on where oral histories fit within the larger national narratives and historical contexts.

# Course Objectives:

- To critically assess how and why historical events are remembered and forgotten
- To situate where oral histories fit within the larger national narratives and historical contexts
- To connect local Vancouver history to history of Asian migration in the Americas
- To develop oral history interview techniques and film techniques
