

- Rashomon Effect: contradictory interpretations of the same events by different persons, a problem that often arises in the process of uncovering truth.

## TO BE HONEST...

## ASSESSING RELIABILITY OF NARRATOR

- compare narrator's words and behaviour
- compare narrator's description with other characters' description
- is the narrator too self-interested or emotional? Is he/she experienced, knowledgeable, moral, healthy enough to be reliable?
- check for consistency
