a. Research a dance group that specializes in this dance style (link to a dance video and website required). Talk about the dance group. - 150 words
b. For each, explain who the dancers are and why you picked this over other videos.
c. If it is from a competition or a show, explain what they are.
5. Add a link to $\mathbf{1}$ video demonstrating the style from impressive teenagers doing this style.
a. For each, explain who the dancers are and why you picked this over other videos.
b. If it is from a competition or a show, explain what they are.
6. Give the link to a dance video of this style that you can see yourself being able to learn. Explain why you chose this video.
7. Expand on what you like and dislike about this dance style

- 150 words
c. Research project on Google Slides must be written on the computer and include a bibliography (at the bottom of each speakers' notes).
d. Each slide must only include the key points. All the detailed research information MUST be written in the speaker's notes for the appropriate style so I can read all the additional information and explanation.
