Summary of Unit:

Musical Concepts to be learned: Major and Minor Key Signatures

Note: This lesson would be appropriate for an eighth grade general music class, but it is adaptable (possibly using a different genre of music ie. pop) for younger and older students, and it could be used as an enhancement lesson with a performance based class (e.g., band, choir, or orchestra). Teaching of this lesson could be spread over 1-3 meetings of the class.

Objective:

Given a demonstration, discussion, and guided practice in key signatures, the students will demonstrate the ability to define major and minor key signatures on a written, listening-based quiz administered in-class at the end of the unit. (Percentage grade.)
