Core Competencies:

Incorporation of Aboriginal Education:

First Peoples Principles of Learning:

- Learning involves patience and time.

Diversification/Differentiation:

- For students that are more advanced with writing, ask them to label as many of their "Oo" words in their picture as they can.
- Students needing extra support can be asked to copy written labels on their picture or teacher can write a dot to dot "Oo" for the student to trace.

Assessment Tools & Strategies:

- Students will write capital and lowercase "Oo" in letter journal (6 each).
- Students will draw/color pictures of words that start with "Oo".
- Students will attempt to label pictures of the words that start with "Oo".

Resources/Materials:

Method:

Prep: Know how to make the sound “Oo”, how to describe the formation of the written letter, load the video to be shown on the projector/screen, create “Oo” worksheet for students to complete (this sheet goes into their book of letters), and have “Oo” words prepared: on the poster: October, orange, olives, onion, orca, etc.

Lesson:

1. Gather and settle the students on the carpet area and ask them to use their nicest singing voices to sing along with the video – stop the song if students are acting silly/not singing nicely
2. Show students the list of “Oo” words
3. Read them aloud once and then ask the students to join you while you read them a second time
4. Show students the “Oo” page in their book of letters and review the steps: (1) ‘what goes here?’ Name (2) trace over the yellow “Oo”’s starting at the green dot (3) copy “Oo”’s in the empty squares (4) draw at least four “Oo” pictures (5) color
5. Have students go get their book of letters and complete their worksheets
6. Students will show you once they are finished, address any issues in writing and label items if the students have not.
7. Finishers can do a puzzle or look at a book

Preview Worksheet:
