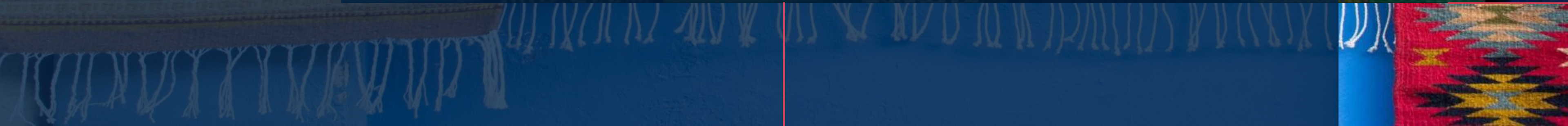

PRACTICAL DEGREE CONSIDERATIONS

- Promotion to year 4
- Is term 1 or term 2 better timing for you? Will a full year exchange delay graduation?
- Do you need pre-requisite courses on exchange for courses when you get back?
- How many elective credits do you have left? Upper versus lower level, or restricted versus unrestricted?
- What courses are offered (in English)? Non-LFS related or Language courses?
- Can you take specific degree equivalent courses, or just electives?
- Can you take unrelated courses?

Be flexible!
Save electives for exchange.

Depends on location, and whether housing is included Fees are paid to UBC or partner university depending on the program	You pay fees directly to the partner university	You pay program fees to UBC. Varies between programs. Check what they include and exclude.
Awards	Automatically considered for the Go Global Award. Eligible to apply for other awards.			

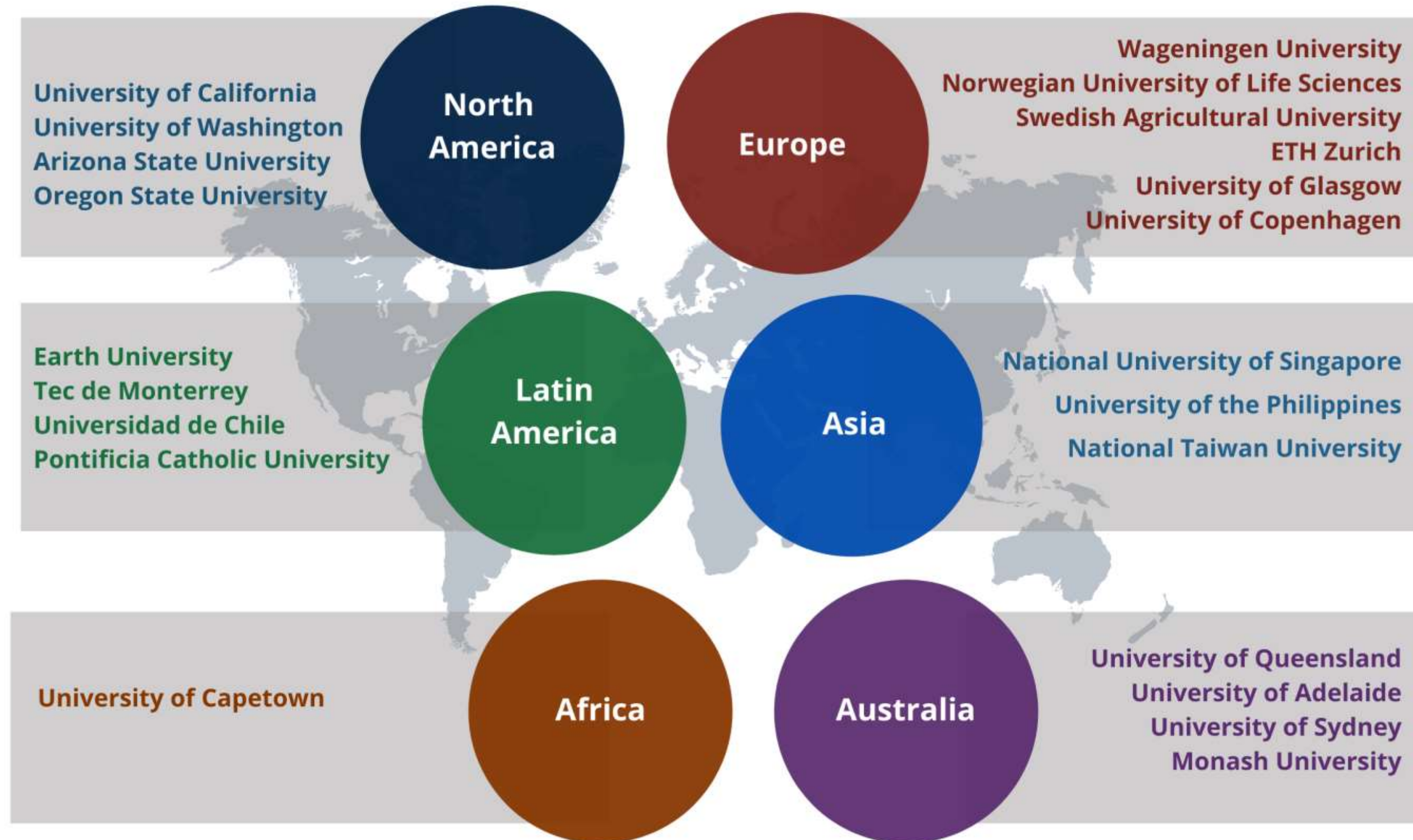


Land and Food Systems Exchange

ASIAN ELEPHANT COMPASSIONATE CONSERVATION FIELD COURSE – THAILAND

Course: LFS 302 D (6 credits)

Students will participate in an on-going research program that is studying the behaviour, social dynamics, bioacoustics, and food ecology of a family re-wilded Asian elephants. Students will hike into a pristine bamboo and tropical evergreen forest to observe these elephants, assess the forest habitat, and survey other wildlife. Students will be accompanied by elephant guardians at all times when in elephant habitat. Students will be accommodated in homestays by the local village. In addition to research activities, students will have the opportunity to participate in local Karen activities, such as rice planting, foraging for native vegetables, animal tracking, language lessons in Thai and Karen, fabric weaving, bamboo crafts, as well as traditional meal preparation.

Program requirements

In addition to completing the 4-week course, to earn credit, students must complete a final written, research project based on on-site lectures and data collection.

Eligibility

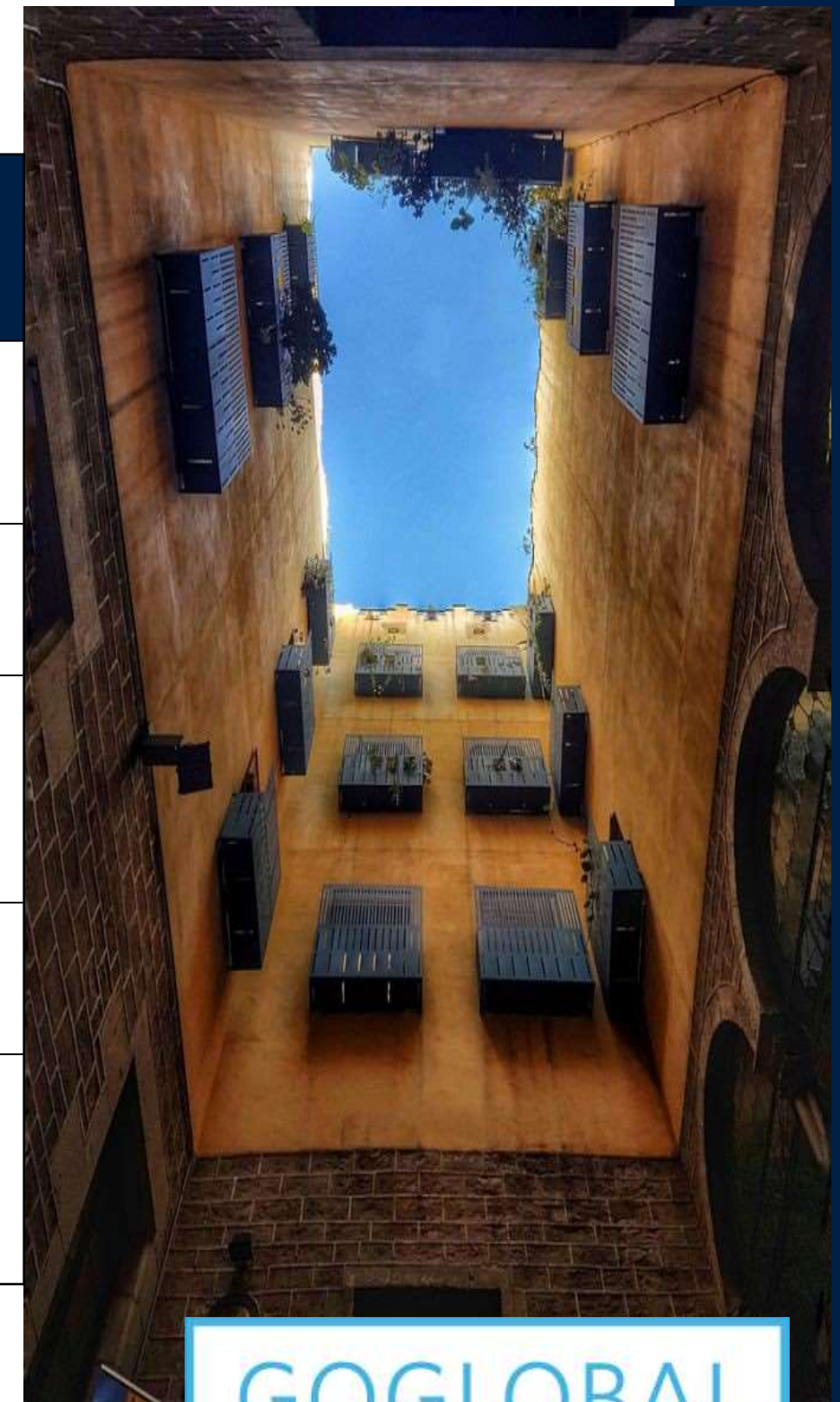
- Three components to eligibility- General, Partner and Faculty requirements
- Have a 70% average the term before you apply
- Be a full-time student in good standing in your faculty
- Have completed at least one year of study at UBC before you leave
- Faculty specific requirements
- Meet any partner school eligibility requirements



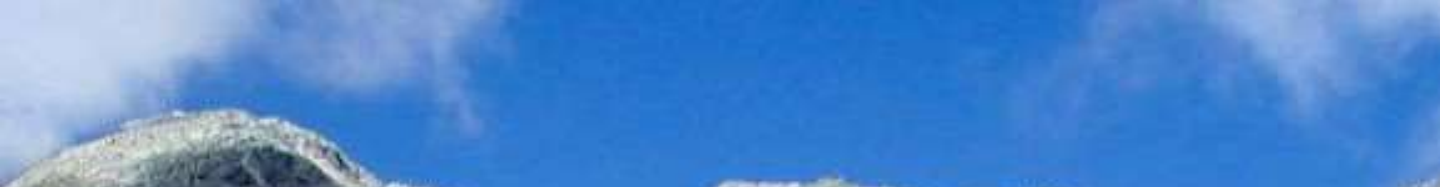
