Additional Notes:

To be eligible to apply for September entry to the D.V.M. program, applicants must have completed a minimum of four full-time semesters and all prerequisite courses at a recognized university before December 31 of the preceding year.

Applicants must present a prerequisite average of 75% or higher as well as an average of 75% or higher in the last two full-time semesters in order to be considered for admission.

Canadian citizens (including dual citizens) and those with permanent residency status must apply through the Domestic Cohort and **must be residents of Ontario** in order to apply to the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) program. A resident is an individual who has lived in Ontario for 12 months prior to January 1, not including time spent in post-secondary institutions. This may include living in Ontario as a child, or working in the province while not enrolled in post-secondary studies (e.g. between academic semesters) to a total of at least 12 months.

All non-Canadians must apply through the International cohort. Applicants who receive an offer of admission should be aware that they must meet federal immigration requirements for entry into Canada as a student.
