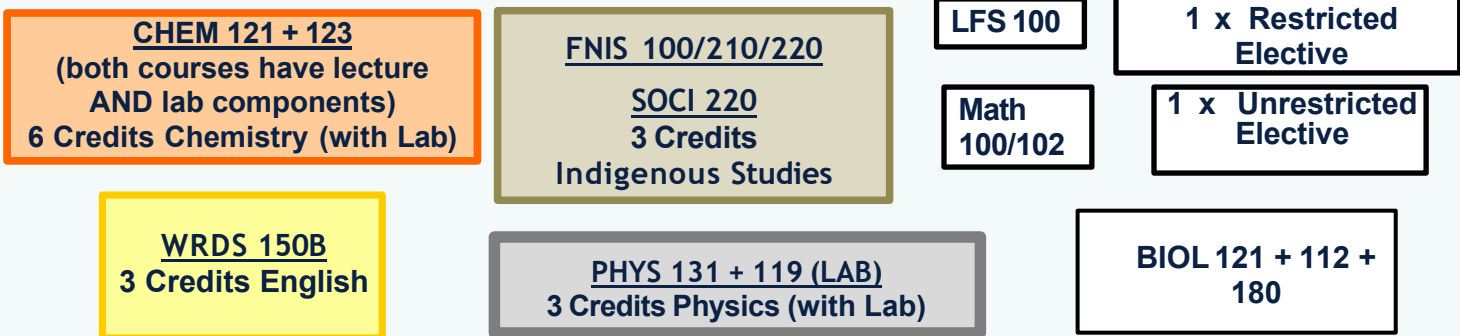

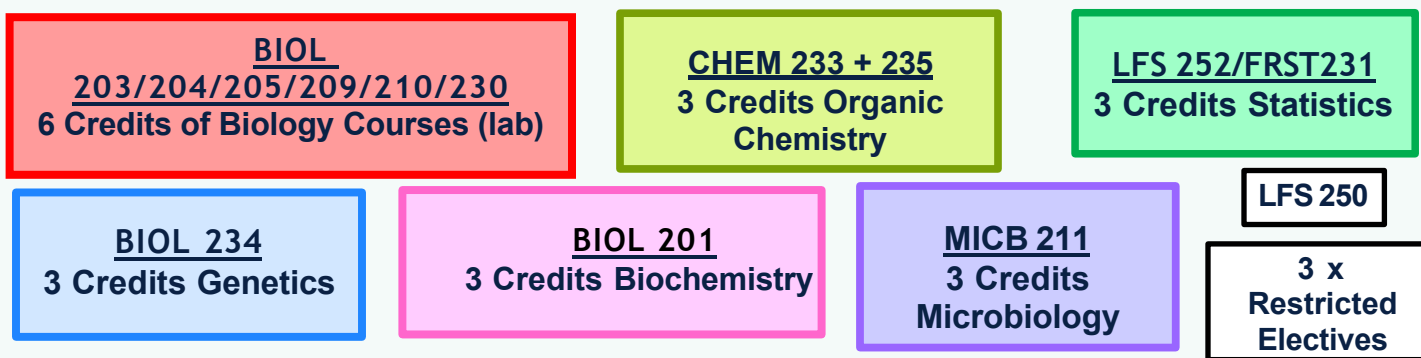

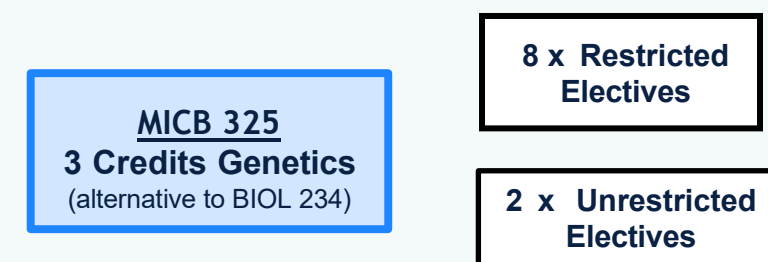
First Year – AABI



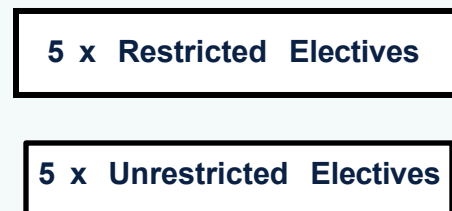
Second Year – AABI

Fourth Year -AABI



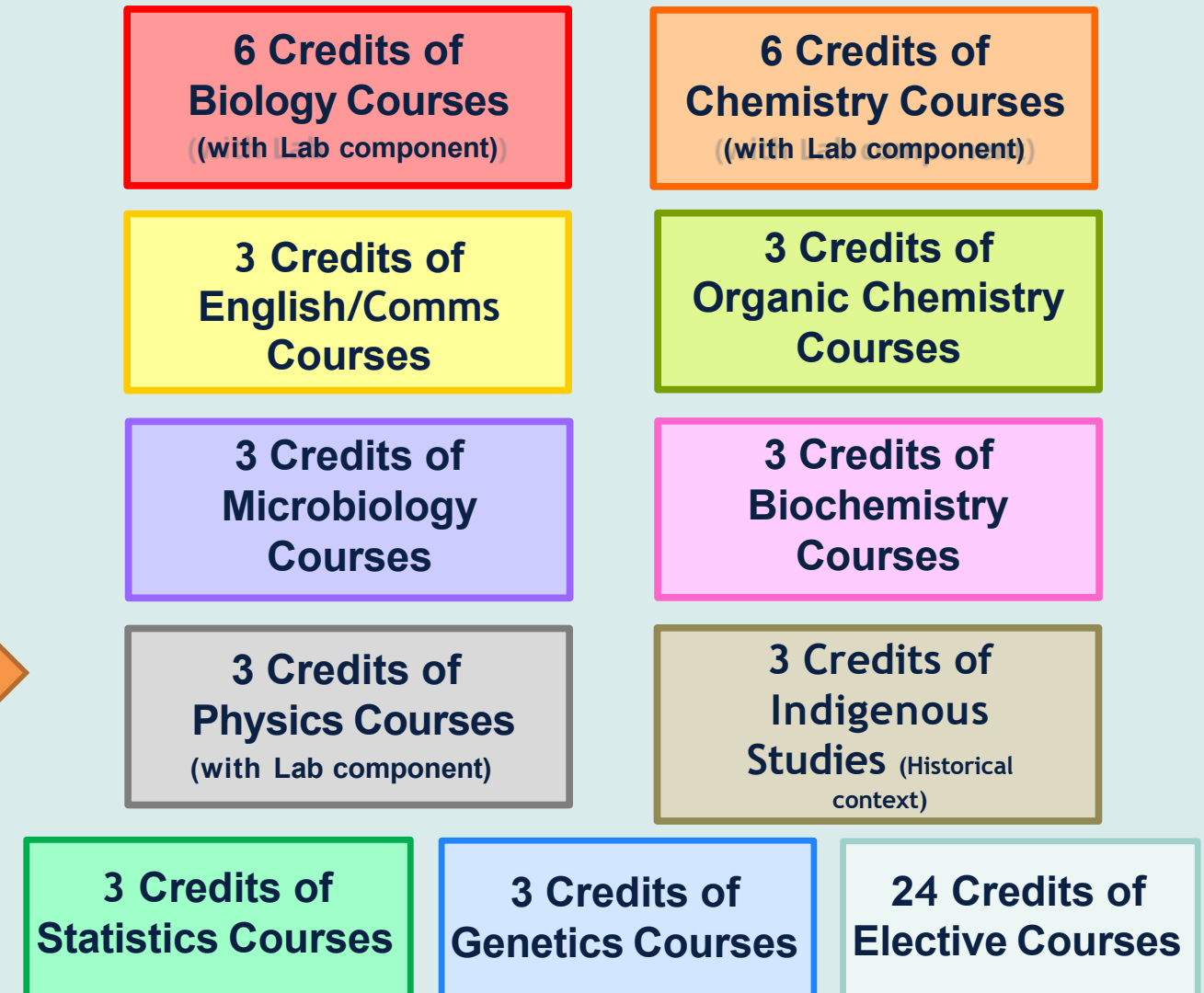

Additional Notes:

The WCVM Accepts applicants who are residents of British Columbia, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and the northern territories.

An overall minimum average of **at least 75%** is needed to be considered.

Full Course Requirement - all applicants must have completed at least two full years of university courses. The definition of a "full year" for this purpose is a minimum of 24 credits (≥ 8 one-term/3- credit courses, excluding labs) completed within the regular September to April academic year.

All applicants to the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine Program at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine (WCVM) will be required to complete a **situational judgment test (SJT)** (i.e., Casper) and entrance interviews up to 3 times.

Applicants must demonstrate both animal and veterinary experiences. This includes experiences of working with a variety of animal species.
