The Department of Science invites applications for a tenure-track position in Environmental Science at the rank of Assistant Professor, commencing on July 01, 2017. The incumbent will join a growing program and a collegial environment that provide unique opportunities for faculty-student interaction and interdisciplinary collaboration. Responsibilities associated with this position include: undergraduate teaching; availability to students for informal mentoring/advising; the maintenance of an active research program; and service (potentially involving contributions to program assessment and development; participation in the governance of the Department, Faculty, and University; the dissemination of knowledge to the general public; and engagement with disciplinary associations).

Specific to these responsibilities, the successful candidate must be able to demonstrate a record of effective teaching at the undergraduate level and an ability to teach courses in environmental science as well as soil science and/or restoration ecology. Augustana particularly values opportunities for experiential learning (e.g. community service-learning, field studies courses); the successful candidate is expected to contribute to teaching and research at the Augustana Miquelon Lake Research Station. Other areas of teaching expertise, which would be an asset for this position include physical geography, geographic information systems, environmental solutions, or conservation planning. The successful candidate must also be able to demonstrate an existing research program with clear potential for future growth and development; the inclusion of undergraduate students in research; and a record of active engagement or leadership with important service activities. Applicants must have, or be near completion of, a Ph.D. in Environmental Science, Renewable Resources, Geography, Natural Resource Management, Earth Sciences, or a related discipline.
