These positions are targeted at current students who are eligible for the <a href="UBC Work Learn Program">UBC Work Learn Program</a>. The CSFS at UBC Farm is located on the unceded, ancestral territory of the Musqueam people. It is a 24-hectare teaching, research and community farm at the University of British Columbia's Vancouver campus. Embodying UBC's aspiration to be a "living laboratory", the CSFS at UBC Farm provides experiential learning opportunities for students and strives to explore and exemplify how land, food and community are brought together to create healthy and sustainable food systems.
