Who are Agrologists?

Agrologists are leaders in environmental sustainability, are involved in the regulating and safeguarding of food production and processing, provide business information and services based on their knowledge of resource economics.

What is the BC Institute of Agrologists?

The BCIA is a regulatory body that upholds a strict code of ethics among agrologists, as well as providing accreditation, professional development, and networking opportunities.

What are the BCIA Scholarships?

To support future agrologists in achieving their career in agronomy, the BC Institute of Agrologists will award up to two \$1500 scholarships to successful candidates.

Eligible applicants must complete an application, provide official transcripts and include a 300 to 500 word essay on the topic “What is Agronomy in British Columbia?” The essay should demonstrate an understanding of agronomy in the province of BC and provide support for the ideas expressed.

What are the BCIA Scholarship Application Eligibility Criteria?

Scholarship applicants must be:

- ◆ enrolled in a degree program in a recognized British Columbia post-secondary institute
- ◆ enrolled in 3rd or 4th undergraduate degree program or a post-graduate (Masters) program
- ◆ full-time or part-time (no fewer than 2 courses)
- ◆ enrolled in a program of study related to agronomy
- ◆ a student member or member of BCIA (Complete student member application at <https://www.bcia.com/members/student-membership>)
- ◆ Canadian or permanent resident of Canada
- ◆ B+ average academic achievement in previous 2 years(minimum of 15 courses) of post-secondary degree studies

Applications will be accepted for 2019 Scholarships beginning July 1, 2019. The deadline for 2019 applications is October 15, 2019.

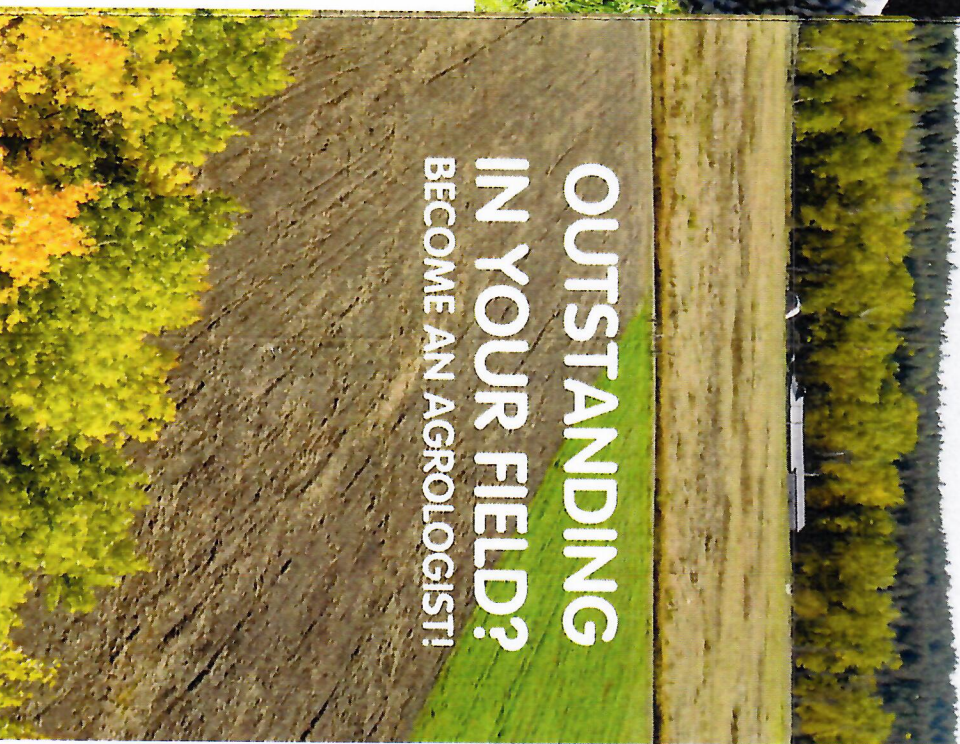

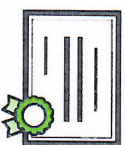
WHAT IS AGROLOGY?

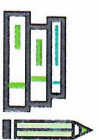

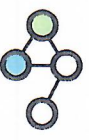
Accreditation
