This role gathers evidence of non-compliance in accordance with rules of evidence for criminal court proceedings and prepares reports for Crown Counsel.

- Minimum 1 year of experience conducting investigations and taking enforcement action in a regulatory field. Preference may be given to applicants with 2 or more years of experience.
- Minimum 1 year of experience in interpreting and applying legislation and/or regulations pertaining to a regulatory program. Preference may be given to applicants with 2 or more years of experience.
