## Background & Program Goals

More than 95% of the animals kept by Canadians are farm animals. In B.C. alone, more than 100 million animals are raised on farms each year. The BC SPCA Farm Animal department works with community members like farmers, agricultural industry representatives and educators to improve the lives of farm animals. Examples of farm animal welfare initiatives the BC SPCA is currently involved in include: the "SPCA Certified" food labeling and farm certification program for meat, egg and dairy products; working with agricultural groups on improving farm animal welfare standards; developing workshops and training seminars; and organizing school farm tours.

Over the past decade, public interest in the treatment of farm animals has been increasing. People want to know where their food comes from, the level of care farm animals received, and what processes were used to get foods to their plate. The goal of the SPCA Certified program is to facilitate and support evidence-based improvements to farm animal welfare standards, provide voluntary third party certification services to those involved in the farm animal industry and to support scientific research and development in farm animal welfare.
