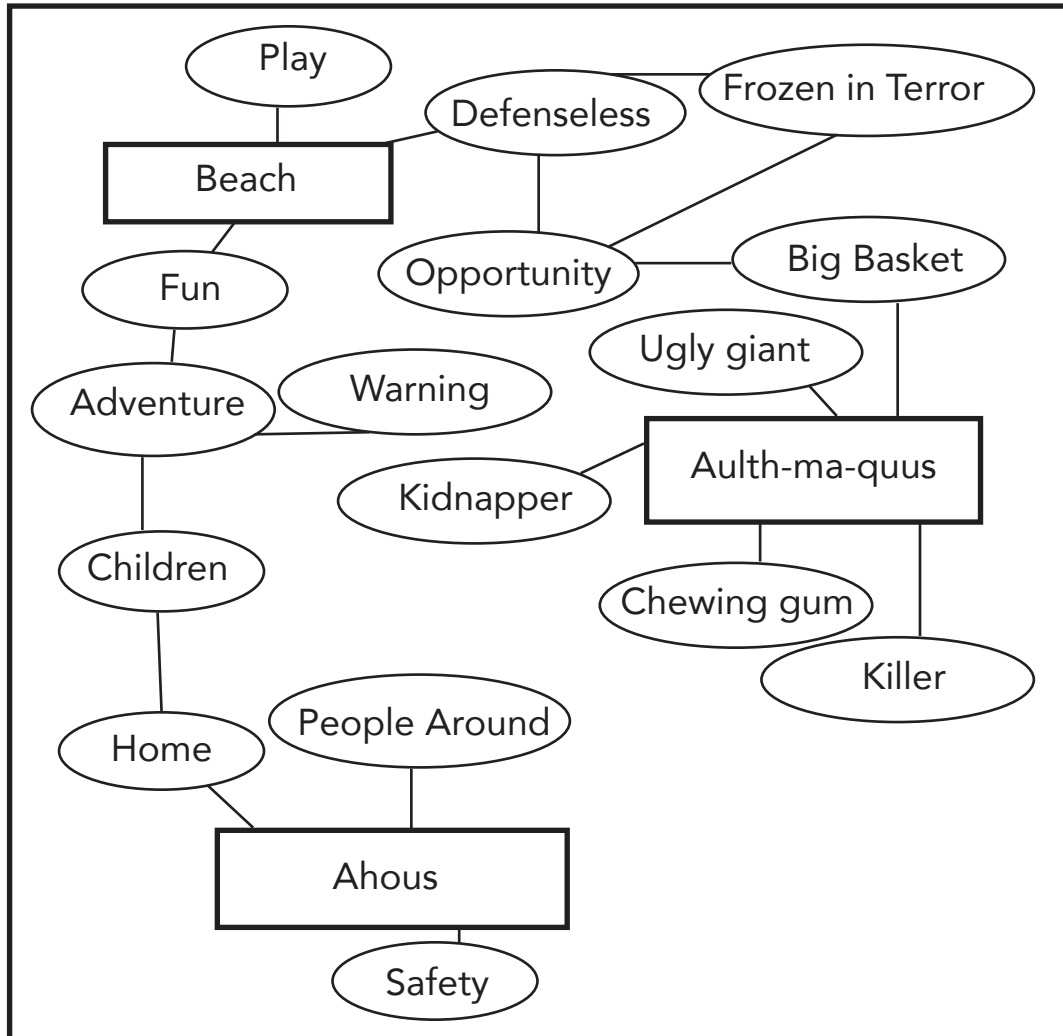


"AULTH-MA-QUUS AND AINT-TIN-MIT": EXAMPLE SHEET
