
What process did you use to develop your idea? Include any brainstorming prompts and approaches?

We all received a large amount of quotations from varying types of literature. Through this, we cut out these quotes and pasted them on leaf cutouts.



We hole-punched and tied ribbon to the leaves but decided that we did not want to hang them just yet. We looked around Scarfe for a place to put these leaves on and decided on the small garden in the back of Scarfe. For the rationale, we all collaborated on what to write.

What approaches would you use to assess this activity that take account of the following: a) the multimedia nature of the assignment; b) the collaborative nature of the assignment.

It goes against our common belief as teachers to grade students on their favourite quote. We would expect that each student participate as they are trying to demonstrate their own favourite quotation. As for the method of display, we think that creativity and the use of multiple mediums, backed by a written report or oral presentation of the students' rational, would be sufficient evidence of a successful project.

What are the greatest challenges in using this approach in a classroom and can they be ameliorated through careful instructional design? What learning opportunities did this activity afford?

This activity provides a valuable learning opportunity where students are engaging not only with the text and literature, but also with each other. As an activity that we would use at the beginning of the year or term, it gives a chance for students to get to know their classmates better while at the same time exposing them to different types of literature that they may not otherwise come across. We would also consider having students briefly share their favourite quotation with the class and explain their choice, and in doing so, we hope students would become interested in other texts that their peers are reading. This project is also an opportunity for teachers to see the type of literature that their students are engaged in, and use it as a way to inform their curriculum.

There are few challenges associated with this activity. For students who struggle with finding a favourite quotation, the class would be given sufficient time to reflect on the literature that they have read, look it up online, and perhaps consult their friends for ideas as well.
