## Unit: Romeo and Juliet

## Lesson Title: Introduction to Shakespeare and *Romeo and Juliet*

Time: 75 minutes

## Learning Objectives:

-use strategies to anticipate content and engage students pertaining to Shakespearan literature

-discover the definition of challenging and unusual vocabulary used in Shakespeare plays

-draw connection between the plot of *Romeo and Juliet* in relation to their own person thinking

	Teacher is Doing:	Students are Doing:
15 minutes	-silent reading	-silent reading
10 minutes	<ul> <li>-introduce Shakespearan snowball activity:</li> <li>Students write down their likes and dislikes onto a piece of paper and then crumple them up into paper balls and throw them into the middle of the classroom. After a minute, each student picks up a "snowball" and reads the statement out loud to the class</li> </ul>	-making paper balls and reading the statements out loud to the class
5 minutes	-hand out the handout on Shakespeare's biography & read biography out loud	-fill out the handout as I read
3 minutes	-go over the handout to make sure students have all blanks filled in	-filling in any missed blanks
8 minutes	-the insult game: give each student a handout of Shakespeare insults	-students have to walk around the room insulting each other using only the words on the handout given to them
5 minutes	-give out R & J books	-signing out books
5 minutes	-hand out questionnaire	-fill out the questionnaire individually
5 minutes	-share their responses with the person sitting next to them	-sharing responses
