MBA EXCHANGE ACADEMIC OVERVIEW

Term Dates: The Exchange Term covers two periods within the Spring 2024 Term*

Period 3: **January 8 - February 16, 2024**** Exam week: February 12 – 16, 2024

Break (no scheduled classes for exchange stduents): March 4 – March 8, 2024

Period 4: **March 11 – April 19, 2024**** Exam week: April 15 – 19, 2024

OPTIONAL:

Period 5: April 21 – 26, 2024*** (1 pre-set course)

* For Spring 2024, UBC MBA is currently planning for in-person instruction only.

**Dates are subject to change. Period 3 and 4 dates are tentative and subject to confirmation by UBC. The decision whether courses will be offered in person or online will be taken by UBC based on government policies and advice of British Columbia health authority

*** Exchange students usually only participate in Period 3 and 4. Period 5 is optional and includes1 or 2 MBA required courses only (Creativity and/or Leadership Development). Exchange students opting to stay for Period 5 should confirm this with the RHL Office.

Students take 4 courses per each Period (except for Period 5).

Structure and Delivery of Classes: Lectures, seminars, case studies, project works, group work, presentations and field trips.

Language of Instruction: English

Teaching Hours: 1 Course = 1.5 credits or 20 credit hours (note: Exchange students take 8 courses over two periods from January to April)

Class Size: 50 students max in class; average 26 students in a class.

Course Load: 4 courses per period (8 courses over duration of Exchange term)

Structure and Delivery of Classes: lectures, seminars, case studies, project works, group work, presentations and field trips.

Language of Instruction: English

Teaching Hours: 1 Module = 1.5 credits or 20 credit hours

Class Size: 50 students max in class; average 26 students in a class.

Course Load: 4 modules per period in each Periods 3 and Period 4

Grading: Percentage system used; 60% = Minimal Pass



Examinations: Final Evaluations are held during the last week of class (during week 6 of each of Period 3 and Period 4). Final evaluations may involve a written examination and/or oral presentation, written paper, or assignment.

Note: Professional Development and Career-related seminars are held throughout the term. Exchange students may request to participate along with the Full-Time MBA class.

Housing: On-Campus, single-student housing is difficult to secure and not guaranteed.

Students looking to secure off-campus accommodation should expect to spend \$1,200 – \$2,000 CAN per month for a 1-bedroom or shared apartment. It maybe difficult to secure housing while still abroad and before arriving in Vancouver. Students may wish to book short term accomodations for the first few days/weeks of their arrival in Vancouver.

Exchange students are exempted from paying UBC MBA tuition since tuition is paid to the home institution.
