
# LING203: Introduction to Morphology and Syntax (1.5 units) Spring 2025 – University of Victoria

In this course, we will explore the mechanisms that underlie the structure of words (morphology) and sentences (syntax). By looking at the structure of words and sentences in a wide variety of languages in the world, we work towards building a formal model to of word and sentence structure that is consistent with the formal theory of *generative grammar*. At the end of the course, we will have developed an understanding of the ways in which languages are the same, and in which they may differ.
