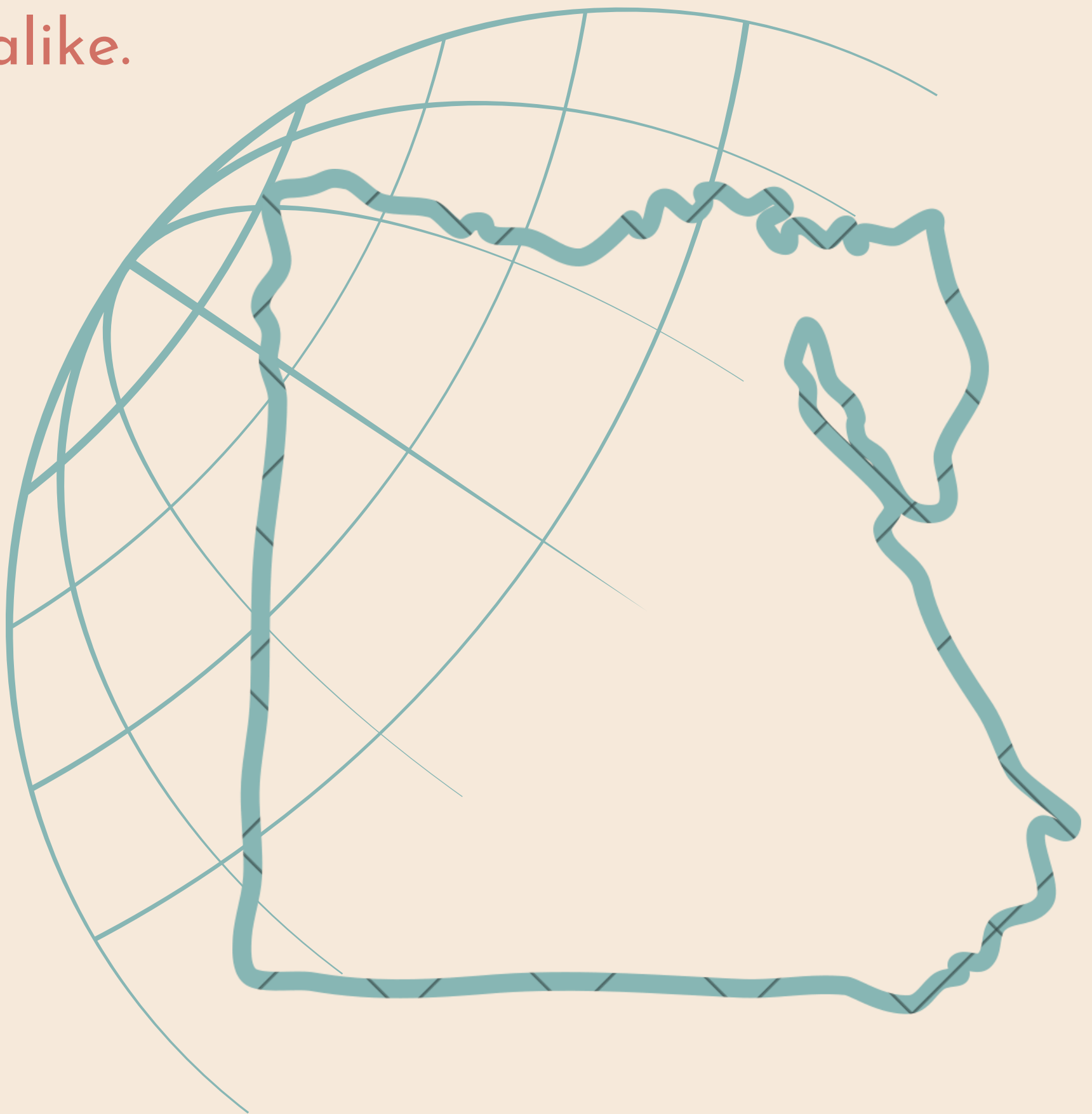

With early parchments, Papyrus, starting in Egypt, this new form of textile swept the globe, transformed into machinery, and unified educators alike.

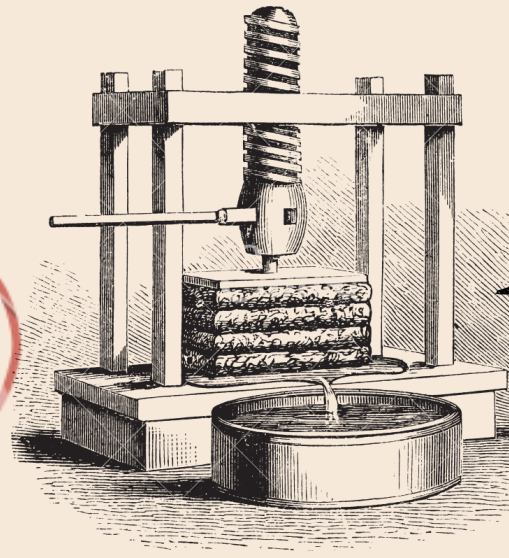

2. Recycled paper
3. Vegetative by-products

Educators are embracing new and interactive tools to support learning.

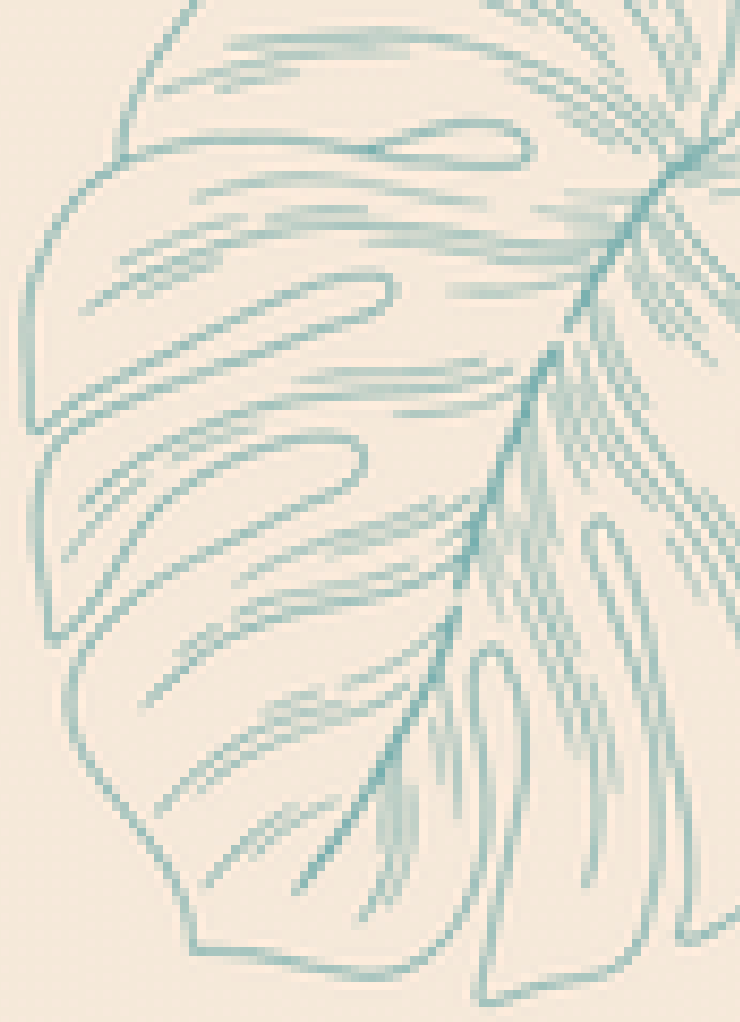
COMPUTER BASED LEARNING
