

TDI FACILITATOR QUICK GUIDE

What is the TDI?

The TDI is a survey collecting information on the experiences of toddlers and their families

- It takes 15 minutes to complete
- Participation is voluntary
- All responses are confidential – individual responses will NOT be made public

Who completes the TDI?

Completed by parent or primary caregivers of children 12-24 months old

Why is the TDI important?

The information will help inform planning in your community to improve supports for families with young children

Before sharing the TDI with families, please complete these 5 simple steps:

1. Watch TDI facilitator training
2. Review TDI questionnaire
3. Read facilitator consent letter
4. Complete data confidentiality agreement
5. Check TDI site permission
