
## TDI FACILITATOR QUICK GUIDE



- 1. Watch TDI facilitator training

- 3. Read facilitator consent letter
- 4. Complete data confidentiality agreement
- 5. Check TDI site permission

## What is the TDI?

The TDI is a survey collecting information on the experiences of toddlers and their families

- It takes 15 minutes to complete
- Participation is voluntary
- All responses are confidential individual responses will NOT be made public

## Who completes the TDI?

Completed by parent or primary caregivers of children 12-24 months old

## Why is the TDI important?

The information will help inform planning in your community to improve supports for families with young children
