This letter is to invite your organization to participate in a research study involving the pilot implementation of the Toddler Development Instrument (TDI). Personnel from your organization have expressed an interest in and willingness to work with us on the pilot implementation, and we wanted to provide you with more information about the project.

The TDI is a questionnaire for parents/primary caregivers of 12-24 month old children developed by the Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP) at the University of British Columbia (UBC) in collaboration with parents and caregivers, early child development professionals, policy makers, and researchers.
