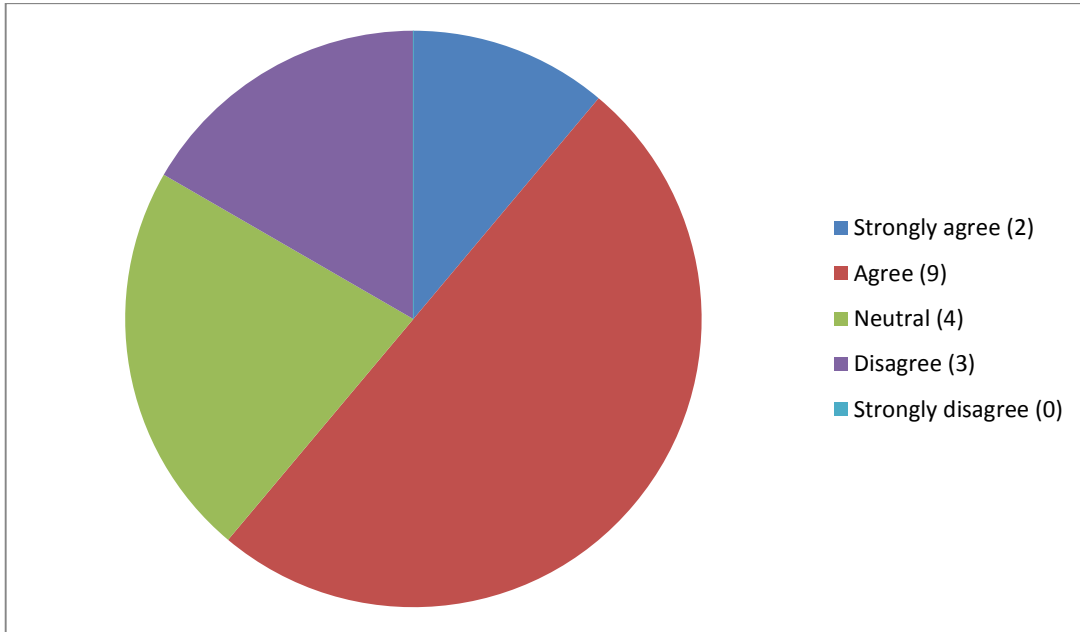

Mary Shelley's Frankenstein

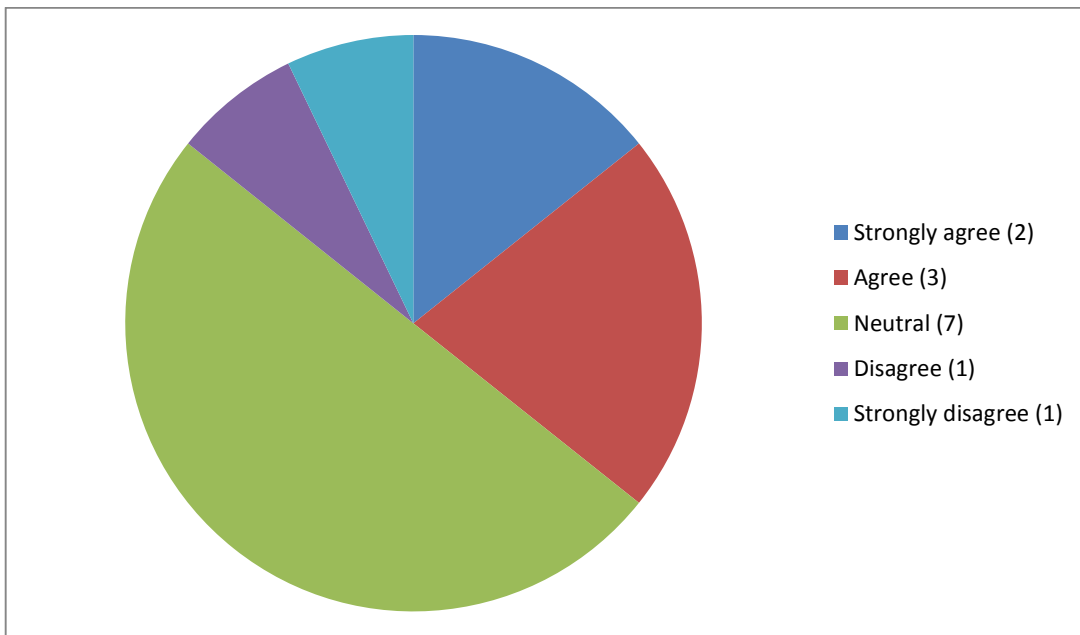

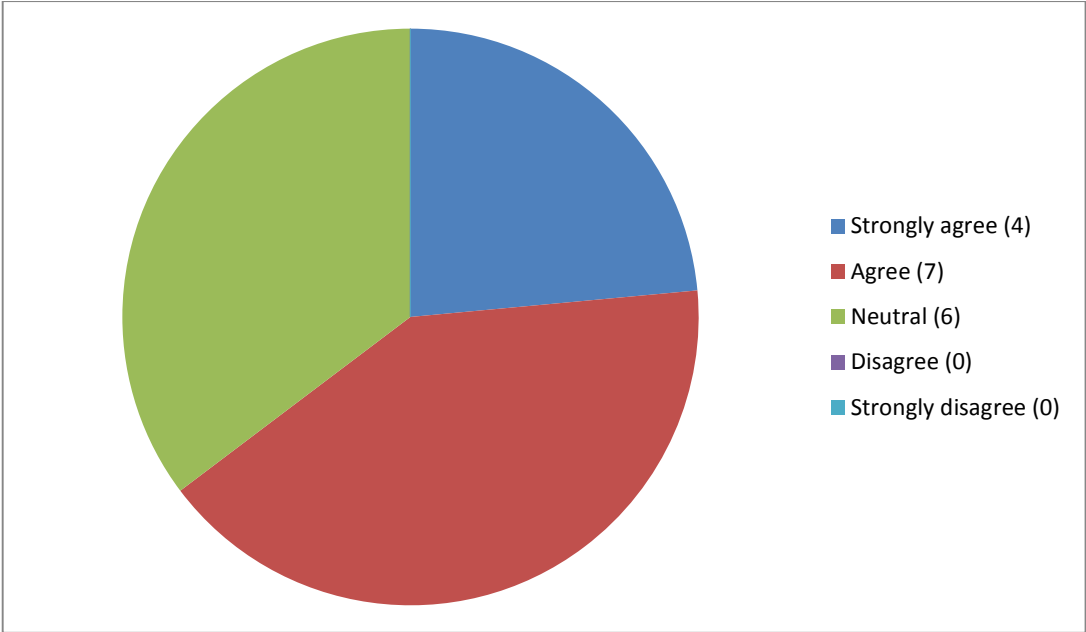

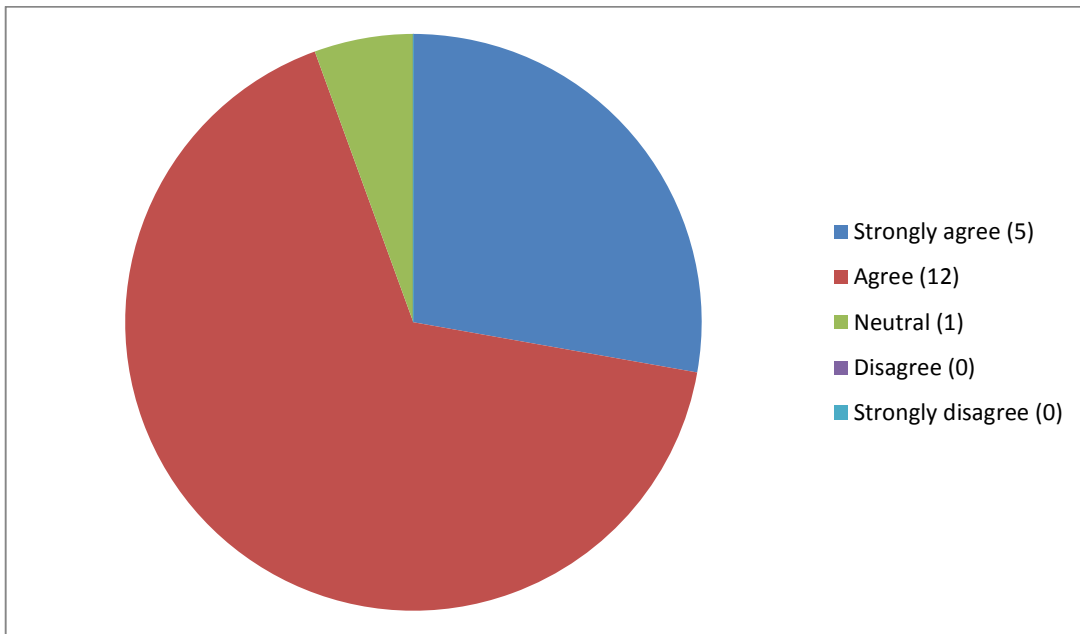
The choice of movie was appropriate.
